With these words our Lord Jesus Christ shows us that true faith doesn't stay locked within the walls of a church, it reaches out to the hurting, the oppressed, the vulnerable, the forgotten, the righteous, the wicked. This is the ministry that our Lord did while He was on earth, and if we believe our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ truly is our great example, then we will follow His example.

On the 4<sup>th</sup> of January Donald and Martin returned to a cold snowy Ukraine. We thank the Lord for keeping us safe throughout this trip as there was ice everywhere, causing many in our team to fall, one of whom dislocated his shoulder.

Nevertheless, the ministry never stopped, and we were able to treat this trip just like any other,

In the centre photo and photo on the right we have a terminally ill man called Victor. This unsaved family heard that we were in the village and asked us to come to their house to speak to their father. When we arrived, we were met by Victor's daughter who informed us that her father had cancer and only had a few weeks to live, and that Victor wanted to speak to us. Donald was able to speak with him and learned that this man wanted to get right with God. It was a very difficult and emotional time for all involved as Victor turned to the Lord for forgiveness and salvation.

After the meeting with the lifers, we went into the main prison hall to hold a two hour meeting and although the place was freezing cold our hearts were on fire to reach and set the captives free.
